

Director's Note: Why is Les Misérables so beloved?

Les Misérables—the musical—is a worldwide phenomenon, performed in at least 21 countries, made into a feature film, and slated for yet another Broadway incarnation next spring. In August, it was voted the most popular all-time musical in a British poll.

As I approached the task of directing this epic, I asked myself, "What are the reasons for this almost unparalleled popularity?" Arguably, there are musicals with stronger scores, more trenchant lyrics, more subtle and nuanced characterization and construction. And yet, respectable though it is in these regards, "Les Mis"—its universally recognized moniker—virtually sidesteps these usual benchmarks and achieves its own unique power.

Why are we so touched by this work? Why, as I have worked with my actor colleagues during rehearsals, do I so frequently find the tears welling up?

I think the answer lies in the source material that inspired our musical, Victor Hugo's 1862 landmark work, *Les Misérables*, an enormous tapestry of history, characters, and events. It is the inspiring, transformative journey of its central character, Jean Valjean, that drives both the novel and its musical adaptation.

We experience Valjean over an 18-year period, from the end of his 19-year incarceration as a "galley slave" in Toulon to his death in Paris in 1832. Released from prison an embittered animal, he encounters the almost Christ-like Bishop of Digne, who, in giving Valjean the silver he has stolen, turns the other cheek and "buys his soul for God." This is the catalyst for Valjean's redemption.

A further crisis of conscience comes eight years later. Having assumed a new identity, he has established himself as a successful business owner, employing hundreds of hitherto impoverished workers. He is now "Monsieur Madeleine" and the Mayor of Montreuil-sur-Mer. Madeleine's prefect of police is Inspector Javert, from whom he learns of a man who has been mistaken for Valjean and is awaiting trial. The real Valjean must wrestle with either speaking out or remaining silent. Each carries its consequences: surrendering his freedom or surrendering his soul. With his choice, Valjean enters a deeper and more profound stage of his moral transformation.

Valjean's equally fascinating adversary throughout is Police Inspector Javert. The son of a galley slave himself, Javert responds to his own unsavory roots with an unyielding quest to defend the letter of the law. The "stars" he sings about are his unalterable moral anchors. In his absolute sense of right and wrong, he is ultimately undone by an act of Valjean's generosity. In an echo of the Bishop's gesture toward himself 18 years earlier, Valjean spares Javert's life. But given Javert's inflexible moral code, Valjean's action renders that life unlivable.

Apart from the sweep and grandeur of the musical, *Les Misérables* touches me with its hunger for moral goodness, its compassion for the plight of those who suffer, its intolerance of social evils, and its laid-bare portrait of a man struggling to do good. It is a story of transformation in the face of impossible odds.

In presenting *Les Misérables* to you, we were cognizant of working in a small theater with necessarily limited technical marvels. Instead, we have attempted to illuminate the core values of this great story and its characters and bring them to you with intimacy and power. We hope you are moved by our *Les Misérables*.
