
director's note

ruthfully, before I was asked to direct No, No, Nanette, I had only vaguely heard of it. It was written a century ago, briefly revived on Broadway, and isn't done frequently in community theaters. As I studied the script, I found myself falling in love with the sheer absurdity and ridiculousness of the script and characters, as well as the intricacies of the dances (beautifully choreographed in our production by Lee Ann Payne). I tend to gravitate towards, and direct, more modern musicals, so while falling in love with a lost show from the 1920s wasn't on my 2024 bingo card, I'm thrilled the universe brought me this opportunity.

What I have fallen in love with even more than the show, however, is the community at SBMT. This is my first show here, and I am consistently impressed with the passion and organization this group of artists brings to



each rehearsal and production meeting. Everyone wants to make a good show, but even more importantly, they want to build relationships, have fun, and respect each other along the way. This is an exceptional community, and I feel beyond blessed to have spent the last few months playing here.

So I hope the next 2 hours of your life watching this outrageous show are fun and light and help you escape whatever stresses you outside the theater's doors. Enjoy!

duction of *Into the Woods Jr.* Outside of her performance-related activities, Maya enjoys crocheting, playing with her three dogs, and watching Formula 1.



Outside the theatre and sewing room, she loves hanging out at home with her husband, daughter, and two silly dogs.



Dan Singletary (Sound Designer) has been an active SBMT member since 2003, when he first played trombone in our orchestra. He quickly moved on to music direct many of our productions, including A Gentleman's Guide to Love & Murder; The Bridges of Madison County; City of Angels; Hairspray; Les Misérables; Promises, Promises; 42nd

Remembering Dottie Lester-White

South Bay Musical Theatre is dedicating these performances of *No, No, Nanette* to the memory of Dottie Lester-White. Dottie was a beloved performer, dance

teacher, and choreographer in the Bay Area and beyond. She performed on Broadway in Katharine Hepburn's Coco (1970) and Ruby Keeler's revival of No, No, Nanette (1971), and in national touring companies of Nanette, Hello, Dolly!, Cabaret, Mame, and Sugar. She choreographed for theater companies throughout the Bay Area, as well as in Phoenix and the Midwest. Bay Area credits include American Musical Theatre of San Jose, Hillbarn Theatre, Foothill Music Theatre, San Jose Civic Light Opera, San Jose Repertory Theatre, San Jose Stage Company, Tabard Theatre, Theatre On San Pedro Square, Theatre-Works of Silicon Valley, West Valley Light Opera, Woodminster Amphitheater, and of course South Bay Musical Theatre. She was a treasured dance teacher and taught at Notre Dame De Namur University, Santa Clara University, Cañada College, and DeAnza College, as well as at various private studios. She even taught tap-dancing via Zoom during the pandemic!

Dottie first worked with Saratoga Drama Group (SBMT's original name) back in 1974 with *High Button Shoes*, which she co-choreographed with her then-husband Mike Lidster. Additional SDG/SBMT credits: *Hello, Dolly!* (1980 and 2010), Guys and Dolls (1983), Kiss Me, Kate (1992), No, No, Nanette (1993), and *The Goodbye Girl* (2000). Her lively, compelling choreography ranged from modern to jazz to show-stopping tap dance numbers. She was known for her ability to teach to all dancers' abilities, from "non-dancing" ensemble to accomplished pros. And her signature line was always: "Keep a dancing heart!" Dot-


tie's other passions included baseball and football, and she ended one of her SBMT program bios with "Go Giants and Niners!"

Dottie passed away on August 17, 2023 in Mesa, Arizona, where she was choreographing a production of *Hello, Dolly!* She is greatly missed, and her artistry, wit, and kindness will remain in our hearts forever.
