director's note

"It's the oldest story: masses are oppressed. Faces, clothes, and bladders all distressed. Rich folks get the good life; poor folks get the woe. In the end, it's nothing you don't know"

— Lyrics by Mark Hollmann and Greg Kotis

n one level, *Urinetown* is about a group of downtrodden citizens rising up to demand humane treatment from the wealthy owner of a corporation that manages one of their basic human needs following a terrible ongoing drought. On another level, it's a pointed satire of capitalism, resistance movements, authority, and human nature itself. On yet another, it's a quirky musical that pokes fun at musical theatre and some of the world's best-known shows while still delivering top-notch song and dance. It isn't any one thing; it's all three at the same time — and it's rendered for you to day by the incredible cast I've been fortunate enough to work with over the past two and a half months.

This show, with its excellent script and score, first came to my attention in the late 2000s, and the play's critiques still hold relevance almost 25 years after it debuted on Broadway. I was fortunate to portray Bobby Strong in a production at Sunnyvale Community Players in 2010 — working on that production was a joy, and is ultimately what led me to bring this show to you in my first mainstage show as director.

It takes a village to bring a production of this magnitude to SBMT audiences, and this one has been no exception. I'd like to thank all of our cast and staff for their contributions, but especially Quentin, Emily, Jen, Christine, and Walter, who helped this newbie director keep his footing and handle everything that needed to be handled.

I hope you'll engage with the material and come away with newfound appreciation for what theatre can do, and what we all need to continue to invest in as the arts are continually challenged by headwinds. Bertolt Brecht, one of the inspirations for this show, asked audiences to examine what we see in the theater, constantly engaging as opposed to relaxing and letting the show wash over us. In that spirit, I invite you to sit forward rather than back, lean in to what you're about to see, and as the cast will tell you in our opening number, "On with the show!"
